## Virtues & Character Strengths

- Virtue: "any psychological process that enables a person to think and act so as to benefit him-or herself and the society" (McCullough & Snyder, 2000, p.1)
- Virtues "are universal, perhaps grounded in biology through an evolutionary process that selected for these aspects of excellence as means of solving the important tasks necessary for survival of the species" (Peterson & Seligman, 2004, p.13).
- Virtues are expressed in character strengths.
- Character strengths: "are the psychological ingredients processes or mechanisms – that define the virtues. Said another way, they are distinguishable routes to displaying one or another of the virtues" (p.14).
- CS are trait-like, and are measurable in terms of feelings, thoughts, actions.
