







World PopulationProjected world population until 2100199019901990







 12.5 yrs in 2011.
- Average age at marriage for girls (in 2008) = 22 yrs (This is going up)

Outcome of "Development"

"Urban societies structure adolescence in ironic ways. On the one hand, they have greatly prolonged the adolescent experience, kept it age-segregated, promised young people too much, and given them too little significant responsibility. On the other hand, with less support from extended or nuclear families, children are rushed into quasi-adulthood, a pseudomaturity."





- 60% of youth admired those who use get rich quick schemes;
- 55% believed it did not matter how one made money;
- 53% would do anything to get money;
- 37% would take or give a bribe;
- 35% believed there was nothing wrong with corruption.

5. Family Situation in Africa



Family Situations

- Six out of 10 Kenyan women are likely to be single mothers by the time they reach 45, one of the highest rates for single-parent families in Africa.
- Three out of 10 Kenyan girls become pregnant before the age of 18.
- 30% of women in Kenya are giving birth before they are married.
- Comparatively, only 18% give birth before marriage in Tanzania and Zimbabwe, 5% in Ethiopia, and than 10% in Malawi.








Issues with LGBT People

What is Spirituality?

- Spirituality is how you foster your spirit.
- Spirit:
 - Imago Dei (Image of God)
 - A principle of energy (vitality, creativity, transcendence, passion)
 - A principle of harmony (unity, integration, balance)

(See, Ronald Rolheiser, The Holy Longing, 1999.)

What is Spirituality?

- Spirituality is about how we foster the image of God within us.
- Spirituality is recognising the movement of God within us and responding to it every moment.
- But the <u>image of God is embodied</u> it is part of the human person.
- Therefore, true spirituality entails the <u>integration of</u> <u>the different dimensions</u> of the human person.
- That is WHOLENESS!



Characteristics of Religious Spirituality

- Integrated and holistic worldview: marked by harmony and balance;
- Provisional and heuristic belief system: marked by openness and a sense of mystery of God;
- Un-legalistic morality: focussed on character and marked by a deep compassion for all;
- Focussed on meaning and sense of purpose about life: search for meaning rather than dogma.

- It integrates the different dimensions of human beings: physical, spiritual, intellectual, socio-emotional.






